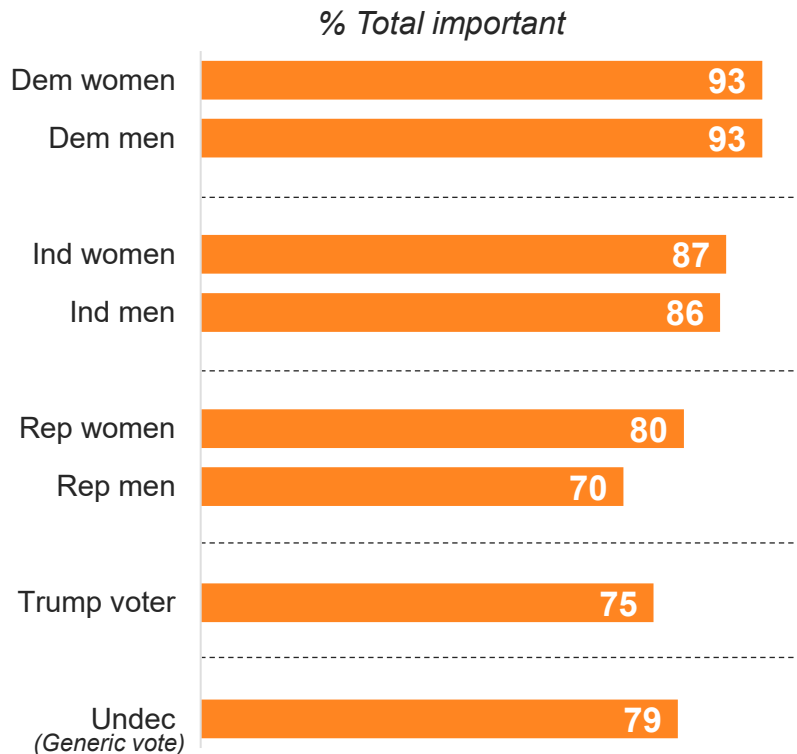
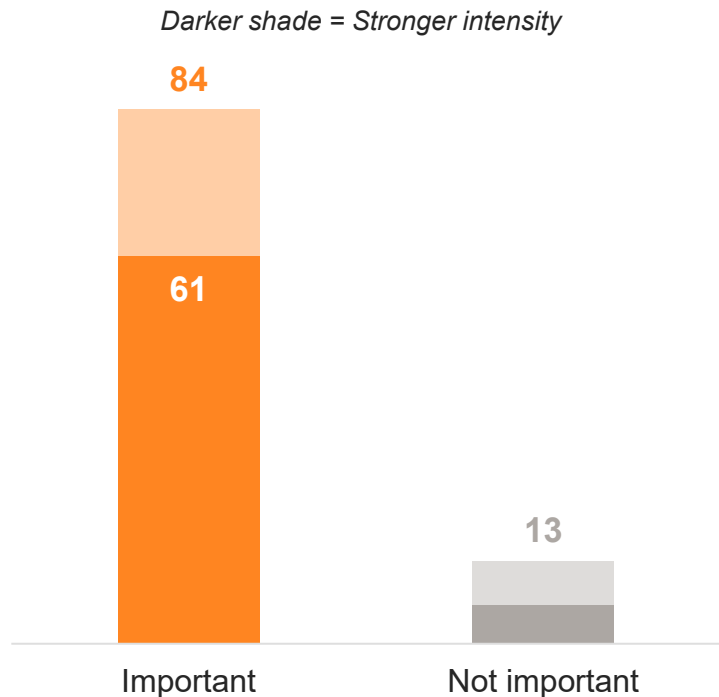
- Across party lines, voters want justice and accountability on Epstein and say it's important to their vote for Congress.

How important is it to you that the government release all remaining records related to Jeffrey Epstein and investigate anyone who may have committed crimes?



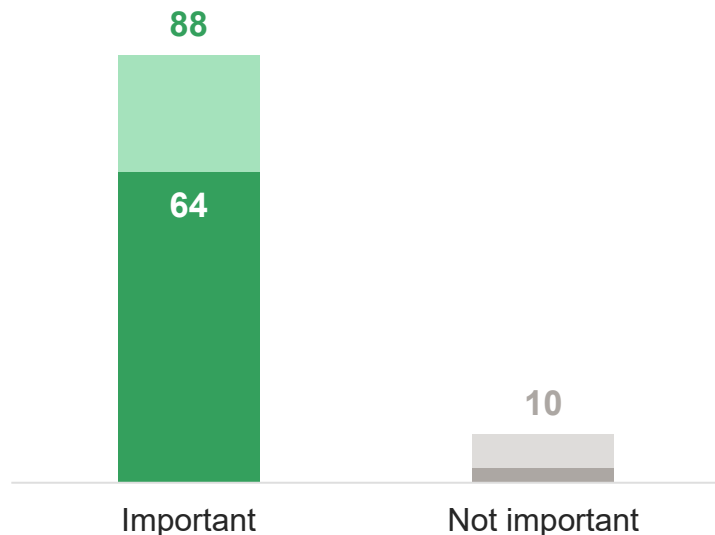

How important is the issue of *corruption and holding powerful people accountable, including through the release of the full Epstein files*, to your vote for Congress this year?

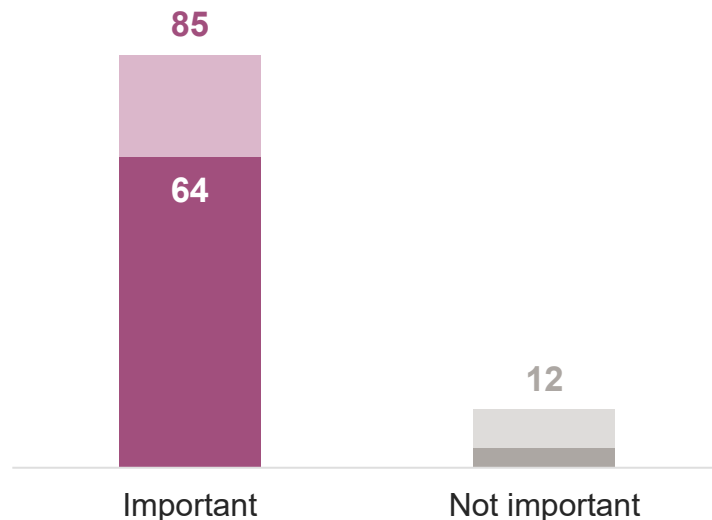
Darker shade = Stronger intensity

Darker shade = Stronger intensity

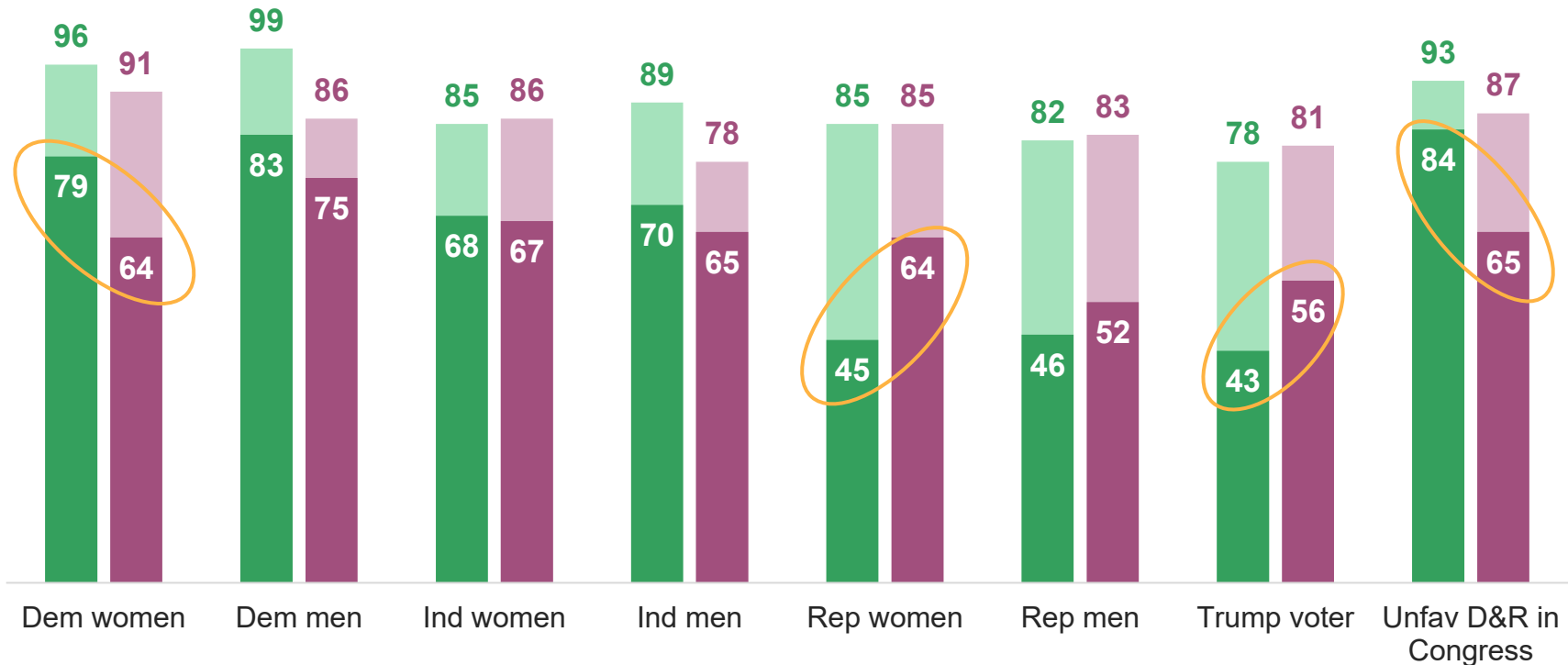

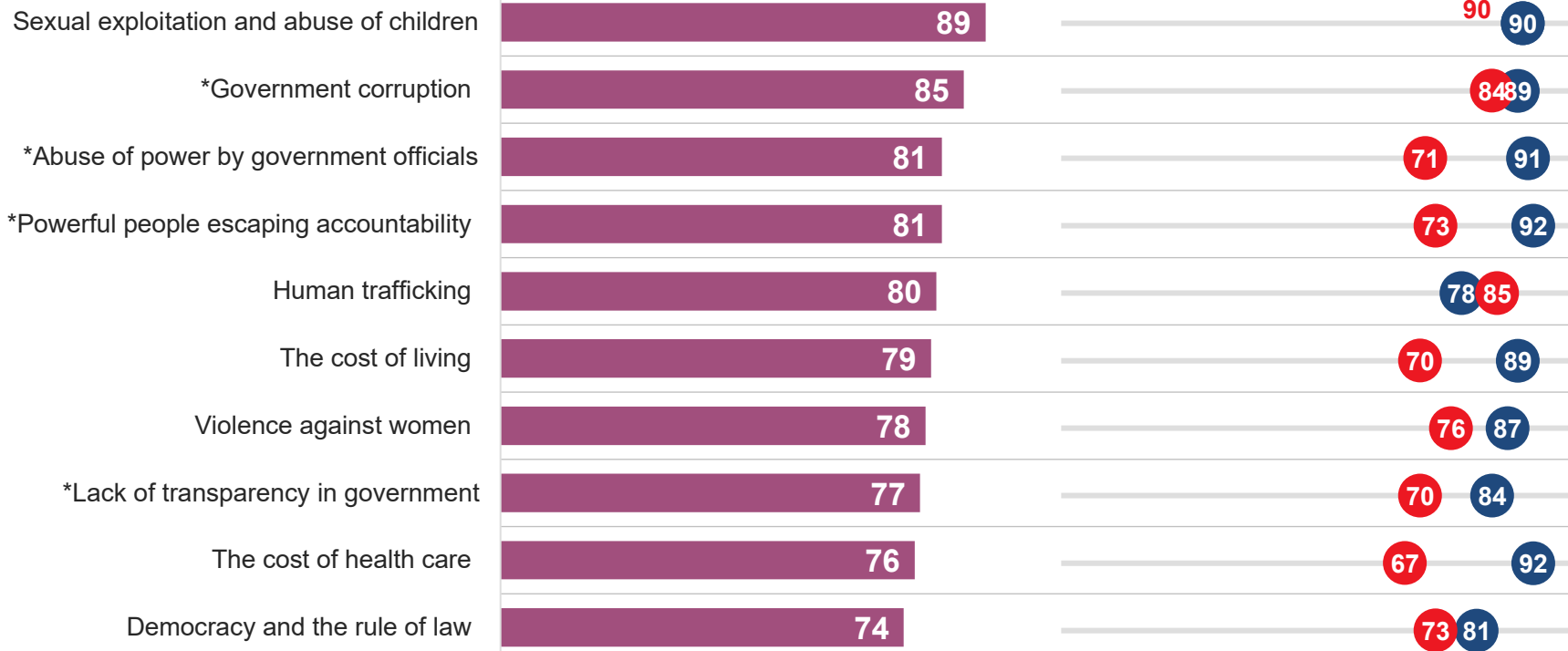

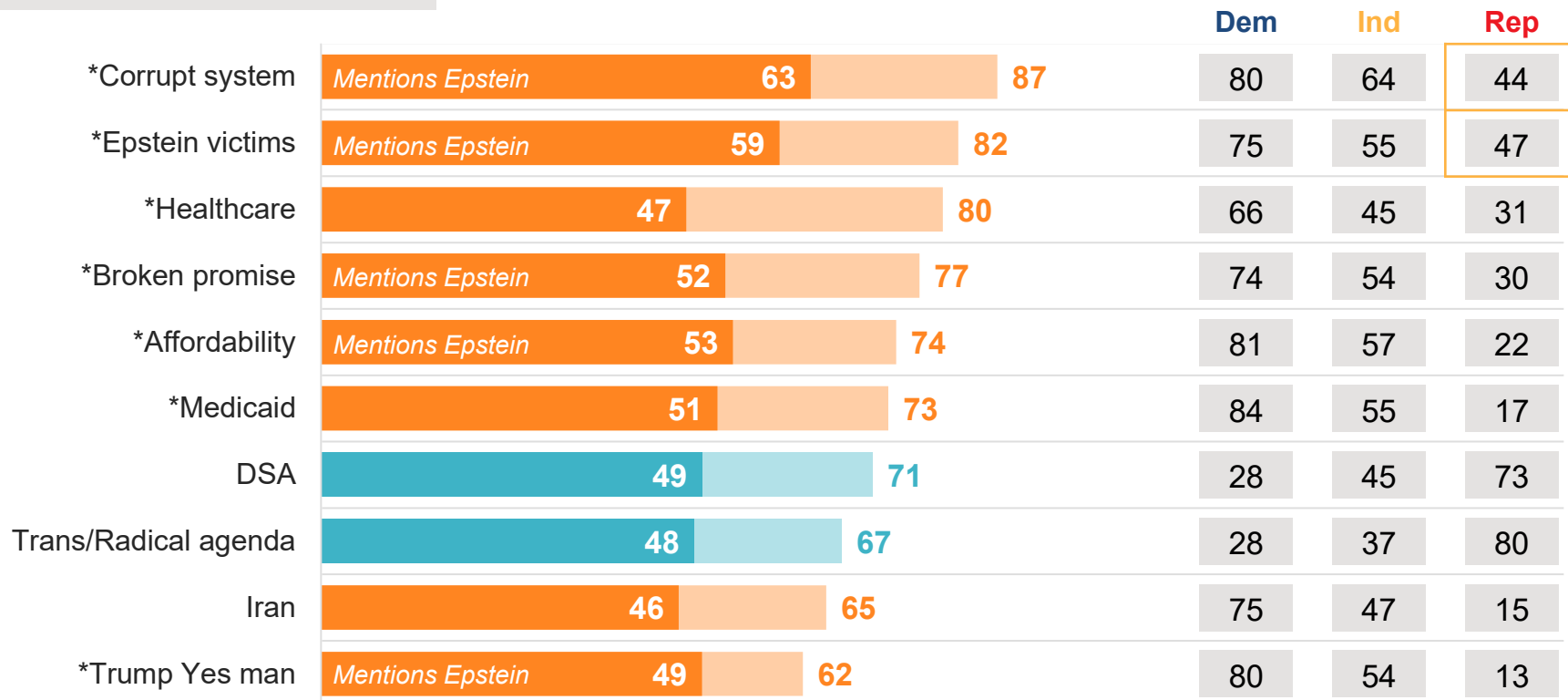
